Join us to learn more about legal careers and the Michigan courts.



- **7th–9th grade** students explore a range of law-related careers through tours and activities. They meet with justices, judges, lawyers, and other legal professionals, and observe proceedings at a local trial court.
 - **10th–12th grade** students prepare and present a moot court case, similar to arguments before the Michigan Supreme Court. They serve as attorneys, justices, and other major players. Participants meet with justices, lawyers, and other legal professionals to prepare the case. This year's case examines constitutional protections against unreasonable search and seizure. Among the issues are whether evidence found by a firefighter on an emergency call should be treated the same as a police officer responding in an emergency.

Both sessions meet in the Michigan Hall of Justice, Lansing. A \$75 donation to the Michigan Supreme Court Historical Society Learning Center Fund is required. Participants are responsible for transportation and any other travel expenses. Registration is limited. Deadline: **May 13, 2011**.
