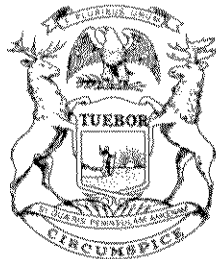

Juror Appreciation Month 2008

The Michigan Supreme Court acknowledges that the right to a trial by jury is one of the core values of American citizenship; and

The obligation and privilege to serve as a juror are as fundamental to our democracy as the right to vote; and

Our courts depend upon citizens to serve as jurors; and

All citizens should be encouraged to respond when summoned for jury service; and

A continuing and imperative goal for the courts, the legal community, and all citizens is to ensure that jury selection and jury service are fair, effective, and not unduly burdensome on anyone; and


Our courts deeply value the contributions of the tens of thousands of citizens who annually give their time and talents to serve the justice system, and their fellow citizens, as jurors; therefore,

We, the Justices of the Michigan Supreme Court, designate July 2008 as Juror Appreciation Month.

We have affixed the seal of the Michigan Supreme Court on this day of June 11, Anno Domini MMVIII, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the two hundred and thirty-second.


