OPENINGS STILL AVAILABLE FOR LAW CAREER PROGRAM OFFERED BY MICHIGAN SUPREME COURT LEARNING CENTER

LANSING, MI, May 30, 2007 – Openings are still available for junior high school students to explore legal careers this summer in a week-long program at the Michigan Hall of Justice Learning Center.

The program, entitled “Exploring Careers in the Law,” will be offered July 16-20 for students entering grades 7 through 9 from 9 a.m. to noon each day. The program will take place at the Michigan Hall of Justice, which is located at 925 West Ottawa Street, Lansing.

Rachael Drenovsky, Learning Center Coordinator, said the program is designed for students who are interested in law-related careers.

“The participants will meet with judges, lawyers, and other legal professionals,” Drenovsky explained. “In addition, the group will observe actual court proceedings. Our goal is to give the students a real-life view of legal careers.” The junior high program includes tours and other activities; the last day of the program will include time for students to show what they have learned.

Registration is limited to 20 students; places in the program are available on a first-come, first-served basis. A few openings are available, so the registration deadline has been extended to June 15. Tuition is a \$75 tax deductible donation to the Michigan Supreme Court Historical Society Learning Center Fund.
