ATTORNEY GRIEVANCE COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS ANNOUNCED BY MICHIGAN SUPREME COURT

LANSING, MI, June 19, 2007 – The Michigan Supreme Court today announced the following appointments to the Attorney Grievance Commission:

Deborah L. Butler of Southfield, pastor of the Word of Faith International Christian Center. Butler is appointed for a term ending Sept. 30, 2010.

David L. Porteous of Reed City, attorney and president of Porteous Law Office P.C. Porteous is appointed for a term ending Sept. 30, 2010.

Michael Murray of Lansing, attorney and legal counsel for the Catholic Diocese of Lansing. Already a member of the AGC, Murray is reappointed for a term ending Sept. 30, 2010. Murray is also appointed as chairperson for a term ending Sept. 30, 2008.

Richard B. Poling, Jr. of Troy, attorney and shareholder in the law firm of Poling, McGaw & Poling, P.C. Already a member of the AGC, Poling is appointed vice-chairperson for a term ending Sept. 30, 2008.

The AGC, which was established in 1978 by order of the Michigan Supreme Court, investigates and prosecutes attorney misconduct cases. The AGC consists of six attorneys and three non-attorneys appointed by the Michigan Supreme Court; the appointees serve on a volunteer basis. The AGC also employs a staff that includes attorneys and investigators.
