MICHIGAN SUPREME COURT NAMES NEW CHIEF JUDGES OF STATE COURTS

LANSING, MI, November 21, 2007 - The Michigan Supreme Court has released the names of chief judges who will head Michigan's trial courts for the next two years.

The high court also named Henry William Saad, a judge of the Michigan Court of Appeals, to serve as that court's chief judge.

Michigan Court Rule (MCR) 8.110 states that "[t]he Supreme Court shall select a judge of each trial court to serve as chief judge." The selection process, which takes place in each odd-numbered year, permits each trial court with two or more judges to submit the names of no fewer than two judges as candidates for chief judge. The chief judges will serve a two-year term, starting January 1, 2008.

Under MCR 8.110, chief judges serve as their court's representatives in dealing with the public, the news media, the legal community, and other government agencies. Chief judges oversee other judges and court staff, supervise caseloads and court finances, and set their courts' hours and work policies.
