

## ***Court-Ordered Suspension of ORV Operating Privileges<sup>1</sup>***

The following table sets out the provisions *requiring* court-ordered suspension of an individual’s ORV operating privileges.<sup>2</sup>

<b>Offense Description</b>	<b>Suspension Period</b>	<b>Statutory Reference</b>
Operation of ORV while under the influence, with unlawful blood alcohol content, with any amount of certain controlled substances, or while visibly impaired — causing death or serious impairment of a body function	Shall be suspended without an expiration date.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(13)</a>
Operation of snowmobile while under the influence or with unlawful bodily alcohol content, or with any amount of certain controlled substances—no prior convictions withing seven years	Shall be suspended not less than 6 months or more than 2 years.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(14)(a)</a>
Operation of snowmobile while under the influence, with unlawful bodily alcohol content, or with any amount of certain controlled substances—one or more prior convictions within seven years	Shall be suspended not less than 1 year or more than 2 years.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(14)(b)</a>
Operation of snowmobile while under the influence, with unlawful bodily alcohol content, or with any amount of certain controlled substances—two or more prior convictions within 10-year period	Shall be suspended not less than 1 year or more than 2 years.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(14)(c)</a>
Operating while visibly impaired—no prior convictions within seven years	Shall be suspended not less than 90 days or more than 1 year.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(15)(a)</a>

Offense Description	Suspension Period	Statutory Reference
Operating while visibly impaired—one or more prior conviction within seven years	Shall be suspended not less than 6 months or more than 18 months.	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(15)(b)</a>
Operating while visibly impaired—two or more prior convictions within 10-year period	Shall be suspended not less than 1 year or more than 2 years	<a href="#">MCL 324.81134(15)(c)</a>
