Since 1990, the Community Dispute Resolution Program (CDRP) has functioned as a network of nonprofit organizations that receive grant funding from the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) to provide Michigan citizens with a means to work out disputes outside of court.

With more than 15,100 hours of mediation, training, and other types of volunteer services in 2018 (representing a market value contribution of more than \$2.1 million dollars), CDRP is devoted to serving Michigan communities. The centers managed 18,066 cases in 2018.
