Dear Supreme Court Clerk,

I would like to make a comment on the proposed administrative court order to create security committees at every court.

Even without a security committee, some courts and court employees are already discussing defendants and their cases with the judge in concerning ex-parte communication.

The proposed administrative court order to create a security committee has absolutely no provisions for ensuring that defendants receive fair and equal due process and treatment from a court.

There are no provisions in the proposed administrative court order that prevents the security committee from discussing and making false allegations about a defendant. The defendant will be unaware of the false allegations and has no means to refute the allegations. The personal protection order process can already be used if someone has security concerns.

I do not think the prosecutors should have a seat on the security committee because they should not be discussing a particular defendant's case with court employees and judges when the defendant's attorney is not present. Law enforcement would already have a copy of the police incident report and can address any safety concerns with the court.
