Why:

Town Hall - The right to a lawyer in the United States applies only in criminal cases, not civil cases, creating a massive civil justice gap. For example, in three of four civil cases, at least one side represents themselves in court because they can't afford to pay an attorney. As a result, people who have done nothing wrong often lose their cases in court because they don't have the legal information or help they need. Drug Court - To honor those who have succeeded in completing the 88th District Drug Court program, which was founded in 2011 and has graduated 62 participants, to date. Problem-solving courts focus on providing treatment and intense supervision to offenders as an alternative to incarceration; these include drug and sobriety, mental health, veterans, and other nontraditional courts. The Michigan Supreme Court assists trial courts in the management of these programs by providing training, education, operational standards, monitoring, certification requirements, and funding. Drug and sobriety court have proven to be effective in reducing recidivism and unemployment among program graduates.
